Engineer DeBosier has been an active member of FICE for 21 years, is a registered professional engineer in Florida, achieved distinction resulting in recognition of the profession through her civic leadership, achieved distinction in her technical field, and worked for the professional, civic, and technical interests of the engineering profession.

Her civic leadership in the Tampa Bay Community is diverse and showcases her dedication to the public's well being. She has served on Tampa-Hillsborough County Expressway Authority (chair from 1999-2003), Hillsborough County Metropolitan Planning Organization, Center for Urban Transportation Research at the University of South Florida, Greater Tampa Chamber of Commerce, Glazer Children's Museum (steering committee member 2007- present), USF College of Engineering, Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering Advisory Board, MacDonald Training Center (Chair 1999-2001), and the Mayor's Beautification Program.

Lennart E. Lindahl, Jr., PE has volunteered his time, knowledge, and experience to further enhance the engineering profession in the State of Florida through his participation in public office and civic leadership. He began his engineering career with the United States Geological Survey's Water Resource Division as a Staff Engineer and worked his way to become owner of his own company that grew to over 200 employees and 6 offices in Florida. Engineer Lindahl believed that practicing consulting engineering, in addition to the technical aspect, membership and participation in professional and technical activities and organizations were required to enhance the profession. He has been active for over 30 years in FES, FICE, ASCE, American Water Resources Association, Florida Association of Special Districts, Palm Beach County Beach & Park Acquisition Task Force, Palm Beach County Economic Council, and Jupiter/Tequesta Chamber of Commerce to name just a few.

Engineer's Lindahl's public service has included appointments by Governors Martinez and Chiles to eight years on the Board of Commissioners of the Florida Inland Navigation District. In 2001 & 2005 he was appointed by Governor Bush to the South Florida Water Management District Governing Board as an at-large member. During this term he served as Vice Chair of the Board, Chair of the Audit and Finance Committee, and Chair of the Land Resources and Regulatory Committee.
