FPEG is the second largest practice in FES and represents 15% of the membership. FPEG is open to members who are employed by governmental agencies, or employed in other areas of practice but wish to join with FPEG to promote its objectives.

FPEG Awards

1. The Professional Development Award is presented to a nominated government agency, which has made the most outstanding contribution to the advancement and improvement of the engineering profession through its employment practices and professional development policies.
2. The Government Engineer of the Year Award recognizes the nominated engineer who has made the most outstanding contribution to the advancement of engineers in government.

FPEG Fellowship

The FPEG Fellowship (\$1,000/yearly) is available for those who are employed by a government agency in an engineering position and enrolled in a graduate program to obtain a degree in engineering, engineering management, public administration, public works administration or business administration.

Duties

Members are asked to participate in meetings, solicit, review, and make recommendations for FPEG award/scholarship recipients, and support the engineering in the public sector.

Volunteer Time Commitment

A maximum of one hour a month is requested for meetings and to distribute information back to the chapters.

Committee Meetings

Committee members meet an average of six times a year and provide a forum for members to express concerns for government engineers. Meetings are conducted via conference call and last one to two hours.
